A brain injury can affect your ability to work or study.

Step Ahead Plus provides support and information to help you return to or remain in work, education or training.

The programme has three tracks:



Fast Track: For those with an employment or education place to return to.



New Track: For those seeking new employment or education.



Employer Track: For employers looking to develop inclusive work placement opportunities.

Who can take part in Step Ahead Plus?

If you meet these four conditions, Step Ahead Plus may suit you:

- Primary diagnosis of acquired brain injury (This means it is the main health condition you have).
- Medically stable (This means you are not having medical treatment now).
- Able to access videocall software (Zoom, or Microsoft Teams).
- Willing to provide proof of age (We are funded by the EU and we need evidence that everyone is over 16 years).
